That does not happen right now for some who are 'challenged,' people such as those with Trisomy 21 (also known as Down Syndrome) can be dismissed as unable to do so. Many such children have gone on to graduate from University (5 in Alberta). But, some do not lead an independent life. We believe that all these children would have been, and are capable of going much further than currently believed, he says.

This is a very important goal for Tedde and his wife, as they have their own son's welfare to consider. They want to see appropriate education for all children, no matter what they may be challenged with; their own son certainly has ability above and beyond expectations. "He is doing very well in school and even got a 75% for his grade one studies! He is doing fine with grade two as well. He was helped by Nero Development work, in Alberta only available in Okotoks.

We need more places like this in every area of the world, so that all children can develop fully. Not just the ones 'labeled' as 'normal.'" Labels are dangerous things. Every child has the right to become all that they can be, and especially in North America where the resources are there to also make it a reality. Who knows, we may even discover another such great scientist such as Einstein in the ones who are challenged, and yes, he also had Trisomy 21 and

Tedde says with conviction.
